"Repent, and believe the gospel."
(Book of Worship, Ash Wednesday liturgy)

Dear brothers and sisters,

Easter is the high holy day of the Christian year, when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He has won the victory over sin and death.

This year, Easter falls on April 17.

The season of Lent and the spiritual journey of Holy Week prepare us for the depth of Easter joy.

Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is **March 2** this year. By the time you read this edition of the Trylon, Ash Wednesday may have come and gone. If not, I invite you to join your church family for this meaningful, intimate beginning to the holy season of Lent.

During the **4:00 p.m. service** in the sanctuary, the opportunity is provided to come forward to receive ashes on our foreheads. Receiving the ashes is a mark of our repentance. The ashes are given in the shape of the cross as a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice for us.

In preparation for the Ash Wednesday service -- or as a spiritual practice if you missed the service – I invite you to reflect prayerfully on the preaching text for Ash Wednesday:

- 1. Sit in silence for 5 minutes. Set a timer if you like.
- 2. Read the scripture passage:
 - ²⁰ We entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

6 As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ² For he says, "At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you." See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³ We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, ⁷ truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and the left; ⁸ in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as imposters, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see – we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything. (2 Corinthians 5:20b - 6:10)

- 3. Choose a word or phrase from the scripture reading that gives you hope or joy.
- 4. Reflect for 5 minutes on your chosen word (phrase) of hope or joy.

-- OR -

Reflect for 5 minutes on your need for repentance.

May you journey through Lent and Holy Week, arriving at Easter filled with renewed assurance:

that He died for you – because He loves you.

"The Bible in One Year" Challenge Continues ...

By the beginning of March, we will have reached Day 60 in the Bible reading plan! Are you on target? Have you fallen behind? It doesn't matter – there is no correct way to participate!

For those of us who started on January 1, we have already read Genesis, Job and Exodus, and a number of psalms and proverbs. And in the New Testament we have completed the Gospel of Matthew and part of Mark.

A group of us meets monthly at the Parsonage to talk about the Bible and reflect on what we have read. You are welcome to attend even if you are not participating in the program.

And if you haven't started the program but would like to, here are the details on how to get going.

WEBSITE:

Go to https://bibleinoneyear.org and the readings for the day are listed there.

EMAIL:

Go to https://bibleinoneyear.org to receive a daily email. The email arrives in your mailbox in the evening ready for the next day.

APP:

Download the Bible in One Year app from the App Store or Google Play. As well as keeping track of all the readings, the app also offers an audio version – with the Bible passages read by David Suchet.



PAPER:

If you want to avoid electronic devices altogether, paper lists of the readings are available through the Church Office.

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE March 2nd - 4:00pm

We gather on Ash Wednesday to begin the season of Lent.

The sermon theme, reflecting on 2 Corinthians 5: 20b-6:10 is "Jesus in the Dust."

Some Ash Wednesday liturgies make use of a traditional phrase that may seem disturbing. As we receive the ashes on our foreheads, the pastor is to say, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." And yet we find that we meet Jesus in the dust when we take time to worship together on Ash Wednesday.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

The Board has not been meeting regularly since the COVID lockdown, but work around campus has been progressing nonetheless. Here's what we've been working on:

- Three (3) air conditioning/heating units were replaced on the roof of the Education Building.
- With the cooperation of our condominium neighbors, we built a new fence at the rear of the Parsonage yard.
- A broken water pipe in the second floor of Hartzell Hall was repaired, and the damaged stucco soffit was also repaired.
- A new roof has been installed on Hartzell.
- Rotted fascia boards on a cell tower building were replaced.
- The enclosure around the Sanctuary air conditioning units has been rebuilt.
- NINE (9) batteries have been replaced in the Golf Cart.
- Parking lot cracks have been sealed and the lot is being prepared for a new slurry coat.
- Beams that support the Sanctuary roof are in the process of being repaired.
- Plans are in the works to replace the Front Lawn with drought resistant plantings. (and maybe a labyrinth?)
- Previous work to deter rain from entering the Sanctuary has proven acceptable. At the present time, the only vulnerable spot is at the North doors outside the Pastor's Office where lack of roof cover allows water to blow directly onto the door. Better protection for those doors is in the works.
- Lights behind the cross over the Sanctuary altar are not working. Of the five lights, three are burned out and the parts are no longer available. We will be taking the cross down and rewiring the entire assembly.




AND SPEAKING OF THE LUNCH BUNCH . . .
