- We have welcomed a young person into service, leading worship as an acolyte. Yes, I'm talking about you, Jadon Miller! Thank you!
- We have celebrated weddings, and we have celebrated the lives of beloved members and friends who have died.
- I have preached approximately 90 sermons (and recorded them for Facebook).
- I have presided at approximately 24 Communion celebrations, including Zoom gatherings.
- In July 2020 I arrived, with gratitude to John Werthwein, Bob Travis, and the

God has done great things among us. God isn't done with us yet.

You continue to be God's people. God has great plans for you.

I wish Rev. Jae Duk Lew every blessing in his ministry here in Sierra Madre; I wish his wife, Yang Ja, and their family every blessing in this time of transition. I wish you well in your continued ministry as the people of Christ in this place.

A few reminders: I am the pastor of SMUMC until the stroke of midnight, June 30, 2022. After midnight, Rev. Lew becomes your pastor. After July 1 you and I can be friends; we can no longer be pastor and people. When you have pastoral needs such as visitation, weddings, funerals, baptisms, etc., before July 1 you call on me; after July 1 you call on Pastor Jae. When you have questions about administrative issues of SMUMC, before July 1 you call on me; after July 1 you call on Pastor Jae. The general rule is that you and I are not to have contact with each other for one year; that would be July 1, 2023. The purpose of this rule is to allow you and your new pastor time to settle in and get to know one another. If you have any questions, ask the pastor. :-)

In my Pastor's Report for the October 28, 2020 Charge Conference, I wrote:

2020 is a year when our faith and our hope have been tested. To be asked to learn to love one another in a new relationship of pastor and people in a year ravaged by coronavirus, quarantines, unemployment, fires, hurricanes, the craziest election year in recent memory, and "the usual" – those who are sick, those who are grieving, those who suffer in the midst of war and hunger and poverty... well, it's just too much!

And yet here we are -- loving, encouraging and strengthening one another to do God's ministry in Sierra Madre, and to grow in Christ together. I am so grateful to God for you. I am grateful.

I will continue to love you and to be grateful for you after July 1 -- no longer your pastor, but always your friend and sister in Christ. May God always give you the grace to find joy and laughter together.

### REV. ROY SNAPP-KOLAS

JUNE 19, 2022 -- Guest Preacher

Rev. Roy Snapp-Kolas is retired from The Salvation Army, currently serving a Corps (church) in Lancaster. Pastor Roy has taught classes around greater L. A. to homeless folks, people in recovery, and veterans. He also has a heart for teaching and ministering in the jails and homeless shelters around town. Most recently he directed a Cold Weather Shelter in Lancaster, before and during the coronavirus outbreak.


His decades-long career with The Salvation Army grew into a vocation. He was Executive Director of The



Salvation Army HAVEN Program for Homeless Veterans, which was housed on the campus of the West Los Angeles Veterans Administration. Pastor Roy grew the HAVEN from a 20-bed shelter to over 200 beds and multiple programs for veterans struggling with homelessness, mental illness, drug and alcohol addiction, housing issues, employment needs, and many other life issues. Over time, Pastor Roy developed spiritual programs for the residents and graduates of the programs, as well as interested staff members. He grew a Corps in Inglewood to over 100 Soldiers (members). Pastor Roy is currently writing a Doctor of Ministry dissertation for The King's University Seminary that reflects his decades of ministry and social service experience.

Pastors Roy and Sharon will be celebrating their 37<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary on August 24, 2022. Pastor Roy is from the Chicago area and has a Masters degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena. He and Pastor Sharon have two adult, married sons, Chris (age 28) is married to Camille, and Josh (age 30) is married to Julie. Josh and Julie are the parents of Roy and Sharon's grandbabies – Titus Joshua (age 3-1/2), and Caleb Jonah (age 2). When Josh and Julie moved their family to Indiana, Roy and Sharon adopted their little dog, Shadow.

Pastor Roy is passionate about bringing together creative evangelical ministry and Christian ministries of service with those most rejected, excluded and forgotten in our society. He cares deeply about bringing people to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, and bringing people out of homelessness, addiction, and generational cycles of crime and incarceration. He loves baseball, and sports of all kinds; he is a lifelong, rabid, diehard Chicago Cubs fan. Roy also loves jogging, has run in many jogging events, and has run the L. A. marathon. He reads voraciously in a wide range of topics, preferring history, theology, biographies, and other non-fiction works. He has a beautiful baritone singing voice, but all attempts to entice him to sing in a choir have been thus far unsuccessful. His grandchildren and his dog, Shadow, are his joy. And barbequing; he loves to barbeque and share a leisurely meal in the backyard.



June is almost upon us with the Rummage Sale, Father's Day, Annual Conference and, not least, the retirement of our Pastor, Sharon Snapp-Kolas.

It will be a time of mixed emotions. Sad as we bid Pastor Sharon goodbye yet happy for her and Roy in their retirement. Anxious perhaps for our future, but excited that our ministry will continue with Pastor Jae.


Pastor Sharon has faithfully shepherded us through the last two years of lockdown, re-openings, more lockdowns, and finally the gradual lifting of restrictions. When Pastor Sharon "met" our congregation for her first worship service in July 2020 it was as a kaleidoscope of small faces on Zoom, some of us not even faces but phone numbers!

What a challenge that must have been to someone who cares deeply about developing relationships with her flock. However, we went on to have many beautiful, intimate, and meaningful worship services on Zoom and eventually in person.




