#### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE:**

#### **Greetings in Christ:**

We are in the middle of the Lent and I am sure that those of you have e-mail addresses are receiving the daily devotion from the Annual Conference through our church office]. 


## IT'S DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME AGAIN!
