PASTOR'S MESSAGE:

Greetings in Christ,

A military chaplain ministers to military personnel and, in most cases, their families and civilians working for the military. In some cases, they will also work with local civilians within a military area of operations. I have been working as a command chaplain at Camp Smith since July 1st. This is totally different level of work. The Camp Smith is not a big base, only 400 military personnel are working here. There are five different military service branches working together under US Special Operation Command. Our uniforms are different, terminology is different, working habits are different, but I have been working together with them and try my best to achieve our goal: 'Protect our nation from any possible harmful enemy!' As a command chaplain, I have been working with generals and colonels.

Beginning June 27, the RIMPAC exercise began. About twenty-six nations, 47 surface ships, five submarines, 18 national land forces, and more than 200 aircraft and 25,000 personnel are participating in and around the Hawaiian Islands and Southern California. This is the world's largest international maritime exercise. RIMPAC provides a unique training opportunity designed to foster and sustain cooperative relationships that are critical to ensuring the safety of sea lanes and security on the world's interconnected oceans. Camp Smith is not deeply involved RIMPAC because it is a different command. However, as a command chaplain of SOCOM, I am strongly involved in their moral and spiritual welfare. Last week, I got called to help two suicidal victims and had to put one of them in mental hospital. I had to stay with him when he was in the ER.

I miss all of you and have been praying for you all. I also feel sorry for you for my absence, but there are military personnel I have to support. Here in Hawaii the weather is humid and hot as usual, but I can manage. I know all of our church members are staying strong. Thank you for your support and prayer. God bless all of you!


