PASTOR'S MESSAGE:

Greetings in Christ,

It's already February. Yesterday is past; the future is not yet here, and today is the transition from yesterday to tomorrow. We know we are on a journey, sojourners in temporary dwellings. Adjusting to change is a major challenge and it doesn't get easier with age. We need God's help and thankfully we can receive it together! We all love Psalm 23. I especially love the verse that says, "Yea though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for Thou art with me; Thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me" (KJV). Because of the old English, the King James Version is little difficult for me to read and understand, but sometimes I enjoy reading it. It is the presence of Jesus that gives us peace in the "Valley of Shadows." We can have peace even as we walk on; we need not fear. Fear is the enemy's tool to make us draw back and bring displeasure to our Father in Heaven, or die in some wilderness. Our Father God wants us to keep walking forward to a much better place! - make care packages for deployed troops and veterans through Operation Gratitude
- provide fellowship brunches on special occasions such as Fat Tuesday Sunday and Rally Day
- hold our annual Alternative Gift Fair & Boutique in December
- explore having Adult Forums with guest speakers following worship several times a year
- acknowledge the youth who are part of our extended congregation
- support the UMW events such as the Fashion Show, Rummage Sales and the Christmas Luncheon


