PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings In Christ:

In August, we had two horrifying mass shootings within 24 hours of each other; one in El Paso, Texas, the other in Dayton, Ohio. I offer my condolences to the El Paso and Dayton, victims' families, with the hope that the memories of their loved ones serve as a blessing. To those who were wounded and to their families, I pray that their physical wounds will heal swiftly, and that they will find emotional strength in the support and love felt for them around the world. When one of us suffers, we all suffer because we are Christians. We grieve, too, for our nation, where no one should be afraid to live their daily lives because of their skin color, religion, ethnicity or their family origin. I pray for our poor politicians who are still supporting the NRA. They don't know what they are doing or they do know but they can't change their heart. Yet at the same time, we are not surprised—at least in a purely statistical sense. So far this year our country has averaged one shooting in which four or more people are killed or injured every single day. The death toll at the El Paso Walmart was 22. And that awful number made it only the fifth-deadliest shooting this decade. Can we believe this? I am so disappointed with what happened to our nation. But the story isn't that Republicans are blaming video games. Rather, it's that they're blaming anything other than lax guns laws and the huge number of firearms in this country. Our prayer for peace may be used to petition God for world peace or for personal inner peace when our own life is troubled. The world's long history has been full of wars for land, power, and even in the name of peace. Most civilized people want an inner peace toward happiness and care-free lives. We know that all of us have been born with a sin nature which will continue until we accept the gift of atonement Jesus has paid for each of us. Let us believe that Jesus overcomes the world with all of its pain, wars, and evil because He is the Prince of Peace. Peace be with you all!




