Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In this letter I want to talk with you about a word. It's not a biblical word. It's...

The "C" word.

Cancer.

Roy sometimes comments that we have become members of a club we never sought to join.

When Roy was diagnosed with stage 3 colon cancer, a number of things happened.

There was that first shock at hearing the words. "It's cancer." Very routine for the doctor, I suppose; not at all routine for me and Roy. Each of our mothers died from cancer; but still, no one is fully prepared for the "C" word.

Life got very focused -- on doctor visits, and blood-thinner injections; chemo infusions and keeping friends and family informed. When do we tell who what?

We decided that we definitely wanted our church families to know what was going on, because we relied on their love and their powerful prayers. Roy has chosen not to publicize his illness to everyone; he does not mention it on Facebook. However, we want you, our Christian sisters and brothers, to know.

We continue to rely on the love and powerful prayers of our church families today. You, my Sierra Madre church family, have been so generous and understanding. As most of you know, Roy now lives with stage 4 cancer. The chemo didn't get it all. At this point, the chemo pills hold the cancer at bay, keeping the tumors from growing.

Roy is such an inspiration to me. He chooses to live life to the fullest while he can. He is working to complete his thesis for a Doctor of Ministry degree he had left behind a number of years ago; the project will be a gift to new Salvation Army Officers whom he teaches and interviews as they begin their ministries.

Every week Roy volunteers at the Lancaster Salvation Army Corps and worships with them on Sundays, preaching and teaching whenever the Officers need him.

He also preaches a sermon each day and posts it on Facebook – for his grandchildren, mostly, and for his friends, family, and former parishioners. He visits his grandchildren, follows the Cubs, keeps up on current religious and political issues, takes long daily walks, plays with our dog Shadow, takes his wife on a date every week, laughs, cries, gazes at the stars... Roy has decided to love life.

The club we never sought to join is a loving, understanding club, within the wider circle of family, friends, and church family. For those who have been through it – their own cancer diagnosis, or a loved one's – you know from experience some of what we're going through. We each have our own particular journeys. Or, as one oncologist calls it, "adventures." But there are similarities. I am grateful for the particular love and understanding of "the club."

I thought I would share a few spiritual resources that keep me going. Whether you are in the cancer club or some other club you never wanted to belong to, we all have challenges and struggles in life. These resources have been meaningful to me; I offer them to you:

One I have likely shared with you before. I love it so much: John O'Donohue's **To Bless the Space Between Us**. The blessings in this book have carried me through many seasons in my life. They continue to carry me.

<u>Anticancer</u>, by David Servan-Schreiber, M. D., Ph. D. Of all the cancer self-help books out there, this one has been most helpful and most highly recommended. A bit of everything, from advice about food to support for mental, emotional, and spiritual wellbeing.

Sojourners daily devotions pop up on my phone and warm my heart, Monday through Friday. You can sign up at sojo.net.

"The Upper Room" is available through our church, and <u>Disciplines</u>, a daily devotional book from The Upper Room, can be ordered at cokesbury.com. Many of our church leaders have the 2021 edition.

Music is probably the most calming and healing of my spiritual practices, besides my "daily" walk with God – when I can swing it.

...I long ago memorized "Of the Father's Love Begotten," #184 in our UM hymnal. Singing this hymn of praise to Christ uplifts my spirit whenever I'm feeling (continues next page)

overwhelmed. Sing and memorize music that uplifts your spirit.

...Rev. Jan Wiley shared Bobby McFerrin's haunting version of The 23rd Psalm at an Annual Conference gathering before she retired as D. S. of the East District. I've listened to it a number of times since then on YouTube; a beautiful rendition of this beloved psalm.

...My son, Chris, recommended "Be Still," by The Fray. I've been crying ever since, and playing it over and over.

...We each have our own music that touches our hearts. Music heals the soul. And with it, the heart, mind, body, and spirit.

"I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." – Ephesians 3:18-19

Rev. Kirsten Oh, Ph.D., is an ordained elder in full connection in the California-Pacific Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, and represents the United Methodist Church at the National Council of Churches of Christ Faith and Order commission. Prior to arriving at Azusa Pacific University, she was the associate dean of student life at the Claremont School of Theology and has served as pastor of several United Methodist Churches in Southern California, particularly as a youth and young adult pastor. She regularly preaches and lectures at churches and retreats, and she remains an active member of First United Methodist Church, Pasadena. Along with Cameron Lee and Candace Shields, Oh worked on a published Wabash research project titled "Theological Education in a Multicultural Environment: Empowerment or Disempowerment?" (*Theological Education*, Vol. 43, No. 2, Fall 2008). Oh also published a chapter in Mirrored Reflections (Wipf & Stock, 2010) titled "Irit Redeemed: Casting My Lot With Lot's Wife" in 2010. Her areas of scholarship interest include, but are not limited to, the intersection between narrative theology and narrative therapy. Oh is married to Scott Russell and enjoys living her life to the fullest in Christ. Her hobbies include music, reading, swimming, hiking, and traveling. (apu.edu)

We welcome Rev. Oh as guest preacher on this Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost, with gratitude for her Christian friendship and willingness to share her many gifts with us. We surround her with prayers of love and welcome her as she brings the Word this morning.

WORSHIP NOTES

These notes describe the protocols we have been following since we first returned to in-person worship on June 20. The procedures we are following come from the Cal-Pac United Methodist Conference, and from the County health department.

We have all grown accustomed in the time of COVID to public and denominational health regulations changing almost daily. And – the world is opening up more and more each day.

As the world reopens, we will rely on individuals to be aware of their own needs and the needs of others. We are in a time of transition. We are hopeful that soon we will be able to relax these procedures.

Thank you for your patience, caring and cooperation while we all do our best to keep each other safe and healthy – as we praise God together in our beautiful sanctuary!!

Sanctuary Worship – 9:30 AM:

- Wear a mask. For now the rule is: we are wearing masks in worship. Extra masks are available if you forget to bring yours. (At the same time, no one will be turned away if they do not want to wear a mask; if you have not been vaccinated, please do wear a mask -- for the safety of vulnerable people worshipping with you).
- Clean up after ourselves. We learned this one in kindergarten. Use the hand sanitizer, handwipes and other cleaning products that have been provided around the church buildings, including the sanctuary, the office, the restrooms, and any areas in use. Be safe.
- Communion will be served in individually wrapped packets that contain both a wafer and juice. You may pick up your Communion packet at the door as you arrive for worship. Communion will be received in the pews.
- Sing! Because we are wearing masks, we have been given the go-ahead for congregational singing in worship. Woo-hoo!
- Be sensitive to one another. Some are ready for hugs; others are not. Some want six feet of social-distancing; others are ready to cuddle. Respect one another's space. Ask before you hug, or shake hands. That's a good life rule, in general. Elbow-bumps and fist-bumps are still OK.
- We may not be able to have coffee fellowship for awhile; we'll see. But we can still talk and socialize a bit after worship before we head to our cars.

And continue to keep your pastor and your church leaders in prayer as we readjust to worship in the sanctuary and church family life in-person. There is a lot to manage in the transition. And -- It is SO GOOD to be back!




