A Message from **PASTOR JAE**

"Happy New Year with the Baby God, Jesus"



Every year, as we get to the end of the year and walk into a new year, we usually say this: "Another year is going away, and a new year comes." As we add one more year to our age, we assume that the new year will be nothing new, even though we walk into a new year of the Galaxy time zone. Maybe, it is because we

do not get taller anymore. Very possibly, it is because our life has been tied up mostly with the same patterns and the same lifestyles that have been for years. Even though we set a few new resolutions for the new year, we hardly expect something new. Is that right?

The other day I invited Bryan and Yojin Kim's family to dinner at the parsonage. Of course their children, Atticus and Harper, came as well. As I had that evening together with them, I came up with an interesting question. What if I had their eyes and hearts in me? How much would I see things differently? I much enjoyed their energy and curiosity.

One of the reasons that I love and enjoy the children's moment at Sunday worship service is because it offers me an opportunity to equip myself with their eyes and hearts. In other words, God asks me to come down to their eye level and to see things like them. What if we see things with their eyes and hearts? What if we walk into this new year 2023 with their eyes and hearts? What changes can we experience in our life this new year? What new person can we shape within us with the new year?

I love Christmas story. The core message is that God sent his son in a form of a baby. So to speak, God is the baby God, and that baby God will be growing up to be a boy, and later to be an adult. 


