A Message from **PASTOR JAE**

"Inspirations from the Alps . . . "

When I took a trip to Europe, one of my greatest inspirations was from the Alps. When you think of the Alps, what comes into your view? Mont Blanc, Matterhorn, Dolomite, Jungfrau and Eiger... My trip was primarily organized around the Alps, covering the countries of Germany, Switzerland, Italy and Austria. When I drove over Simplon Pass from Switzerland to Italy, I was not only stunned by their beauty, but also overwhelmed in fear by their robust gravity. Of course, I would not recommend driving over the Alps at all to a person like me who has altitude phobia.








During my trip around and in the Alps, as I enjoyed not only the scenery with majestic snowcapped mountains and fresh green valleys, but also the beautiful villages of people living up on the scary high hillsides of the mountains, I was amazed, and a few questions settled in on me. A

spirit of both theologian and an historian kicked in. I was able to see the Alps from the perspective of the people residing there, reserving my perspective as a tourist.

What were and are the Alps to the Europeans? Were they beautiful inspirations or mystic challenges cloaked in fear? What has made these brave people settle on the high hillsides of the mountains? In general, what impact have the Alps brought to the Europeans throughout their history? What if there were no Alps in Europe? I believe that the Alps have grown the Europeans who explored the Alps and settled in them.

In the book of Joshua in the Old Testament, we meet a man at the age of eighty. He came to Moses, as the Israelites were not able to complete the task of occupying the promised land of Canaan. It was Caleb. He said, "Now give me this hill country that the Lord promised me that day" (Joshua 14:12). The hill country, Hebron, was a strategic place up on the hills of Judea. If Hebron was still in the hands of the Canaanites without being occupied by Israel, and if the Israelites were satisfied staying only on the lower land, the task of the kingdom of God could not be completed in the promised land. The Alps and the hill country of Caleb overlapped in me as examples of challenge and an inspiration. Respect and honor be to Caleb as well as to the people in the Alps!

That is what I see here at Sierra Madre. There are hill countries in our life and ministries like that of Caleb, like that of the Europeans in the Alps. On Friday August 2, we are planning to pitch several tents on our church campus for young families and children. It will be Camp-Out Night! As I think of it, I am already grateful! I can imagine the young



families and children enjoying camp food, a campfire with S'mores, family games and movie time on the church campus. Of course, having whole families sleeping in the tents is another memory that we cannot miss.

According to the weather forecast, this summer will be warm to hot. I hope and pray that we will stay cool and safe, because we will continue to explore the hill countries around us, whether they are missions and ministries or our life matters. I am honored to witness that our women's group has just started workdays for the Fall Rummage Sale. We are also in the process of organizing "Methodist Ubers" for friends to provide rides to Church on Sundays. Blessings to all!

Please Note:




The food banks to which we send your donations **will not accept** food in opened containers or with expired 'use by' dates. Please just throw them away rather than bringing them to First Sunday.




