A Message from **PASTOR JAE**

"Immersing Ourselves in the Colorful Season of Autumn!"



"After a long summer of warm and hot days, Yang and I planned a little break in mid-October to refresh and recharge. When I asked her what she had in mind for the trip, I was stunned by her response: 'I want to try trail trekking in the mountains around Mammoth Lakes and Tioga Pass.' Wow! What an adventurous spirit she is! She wants to do a few backpacking trips in the backcountry of

the Sierra Nevada, immersing herself in the colorful autumn foliage. I'm amazed and energized by her excitement!

I am thrilled to walk into this new month of October, which is the season of Autumn and harvest. As we witness the vibrant transformation of nature and the fruits of the harvest, what if we reflect on the seeds of faith and hope that we have planted in our seasons of Spring and Summer?



October invites us not only to admire the changing leaves but to remember that God also allows renewal and harvest for us in this season. "Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains" (James 5:7).



A Japanese poet, Toyo Shibata, published a poetry collection three years before passing away at the age of 102. After the death of her husband, who was a chef, Shibata began writing poetry at the age of 92 and eventually published a collection of poems. The title of the collection was " $\langle CITCVC$ (kujike naide, *Don't Give Up*)" which she published using 1 million yen (about 7,000 dollars) that

she had saved for her funeral expenses. The poem "Don't Give Up" goes like this:

You know, don't sigh just because you're unhappy The sunshine and the gentle breeze aren't one-sided Dreams can be dreamed equally I've had my share of hardships too, but I'm glad to be alive You too, don't give up

In Japan, selling 10,000 copies of a book is considered successful, and her collection sold an astonishing 1.58 million copies. Her poems were a great encouragement to the Japanese people, who were in the midst of the "Lost 20 Years," a period of economic recession. When people are struggling, they can gain great strength even from a single word of encouragement from the wisdom of an elderly person's life.

As we experience the richness of autumn, may we also be reminded of our calling to encourage and uplift one another. Just as Toyo Shibata's words brought strength to a nation during a time of hardship, we too can be a source of hope for those around us. Like Toyo Shibata, who began her poetic journey at 92, it's never too late to start something new. What if we not only



admire the changing leaves but also actively sow seeds of kindness, faith, and love in other's lives, as well as our own? Let us take a moment to reflect: What seeds of faith, love, or kindness have we planted this year, and how can we nurture them in this season of renewal? "Therefore, we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all" (2 Corinthians 4:16-17).

In this colorful season of Autumn, what if we immerse ourselves in the colorful grace of God? As we take a time for a break to refresh and recharge, what if we could be mindful of the seeds we planted? What if we are hopeful for the harvest and renewal God offers us each day? I am grateful to journey alongside you.




